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**Guidelines for Chhattisgarh Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata
Yojna**

- 1) **Name of the Scheme** – The name of this scheme is “Chhattisgarh Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna”
- 2) **Commencement of the Scheme** – The work of making Ration Cards under this scheme shall commence immediately. The distribution of commodities under this scheme shall begin from 1st April 2007.
- 3) **Objective of the Scheme** - Objective of the scheme is to distribute commodities of Public Distribution System to poor families left out from the Targeted Public Distribution System of the Central Government as follows: -
 - a) Distribute commodities of Public Distribution System at BPL rate even to those Non Scheduled Caste and Non Scheduled Tribe Blue Ration Card holders in rural areas, whose name exists in the BPL list prepared on the basis of survey done in the year 1991 or 1997 but does not exist in the BPL list prepared on the basis of survey done in the year 2002.
 - b) Distribute commodities of Public Distribution System at BPL rate even to those Non Scheduled Caste and Non Scheduled Tribe Blue Ration Card holders in urban areas, whose name exists in the BPL list prepared on the basis of survey done in the year 1991 but does not exist in the BPL list prepared on the basis of survey done in the year 1997.
 - c) Distribute commodities of Public Distribution System at Antyodaya rate even to those Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Blue Ration Card holders in rural areas, whose name exists in the BPL list prepared on the basis of survey done in the year 1991 or 1997 or who are not Blue Ration Card holders but are eligible for a BPL ration card because their name exists in the BPL list prepared on the basis of survey done in the year 2002 in rural areas, but whose Antyodaya ration cards have not been made due to a ceiling of 38.34% being fixed by the Central Government.
 - d) Distribute commodities of Public Distribution System at BPL rate even to those beneficiaries of National Old Age Pension Scheme and National Social Security Scheme who do not have BPL, Antyodaya or Annapurna ration cards.
- 4) **Background and Extent of the Scheme** –
 - a) Surveys were done to prepare the BPL list in the years 1991, 1997 and thereafter in the year 2002 in rural areas and in the years 1991 and

1997 in urban areas. Central Government had fixed different guidelines for these surveys. As a result names of many poor people whose names appear in the BPL lists prepared on the basis of surveys done in the years 1991 and 1997 do not appear in the BPL list of the year 2002. According to the scheme of the Central Government only families included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of the latest survey are eligible to get commodities at BPL rate under Public Distribution System. Thus in rural areas poor people who were included in the BPL lists prepared on the basis of the surveys done in the years 1991 or 1997 and not included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of the survey done in the year 2002 will become ineligible for getting commodities at BPL rate under Public Distribution System. Similarly in urban areas poor people who were included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of the survey done in the year 1991 and not included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of the survey done in the year 1997 will become ineligible for getting commodities at BPL rate under Public Distribution System. Such Non Scheduled Caste and Non Scheduled Tribe poor families will be given commodities at BPL rate under Public Distribution on Saffron Ration Cards prepared under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna. For this purpose, the State Government will take food grain at APL rate from the Central Government and give it at BPL rate to the beneficiaries and give the difference in amount to the State Civil Supplies Corporation.

- b) All Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe families included in BPL list prepared on the basis of the survey done in the year 2002 and previous years are so poor that they should get commodities at Antyodaya rate under Public Distribution System. However Central Government has fixed a ceiling of 38.34% of all the families included in the BPL list for Antyodaya Scheme. As a result of this many Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe families are deprived of the advantages of the Antyodaya scheme in spite of being poor. Such poor Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe families will be given commodities of Public Distribution System at Antyodaya rate under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna. For this the State Government shall: -

One) Those Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe families in rural areas whose names are included in the BPL list of the year 2002 but are not included in Antyodaya scheme will be given commodities of Public Distribution System at Antyodaya rate

on Gray Ration Cards prepared under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna. For this purpose, the State Government will take food grain at BPL rate from the Central Government and give it at Antyodaya rate to the beneficiaries and give the difference in amount to the State Civil Supplies Corporation.

- Two)** Blue Ration Card holder Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Families included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of the surveys done in the years 1991 or 1997 both in rural and urban areas will be given commodities of Public Distribution System at Antyodaya rate on Gray Ration Cards prepared under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna. For this purpose, in rural areas for Gray ration card holder families included in the BPL list of the years 1991 and 1997 and in urban areas included in the BPL list of the year 1997, the State Government will take food grain at APL rate from the Central Government and give it at Antyodaya rate to the beneficiaries. In urban areas for families included in the BPL list of the year 1997, the State Government will take food grain at BPL rate from the Central Government and give it at Antyodaya rate to the beneficiaries. The State Government shall give the difference in amount to the State Civil Supplies Corporation.
- Three)** Primitive Tribal Groups have already been given Antyodaya ration cards. If any Primitive Tribal Group family has not been given Antyodaya ration card, such family will be given Public Distribution System commodities at Antyodaya rate on Gray ration cards made under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna irrespective of whether it is included in any BPL list or not. For this purpose, the State Government will take food grain at APL rate from the Central Government and give it at Antyodaya rate to the beneficiaries and give the difference in amount to the State Civil Supplies Corporation.
- c) Only such people are included in the Annapurna Scheme of the Central Government who are eligible for pension under National Old Age Pension Scheme or National Social Security Pension Scheme yet have not been sanctioned pension because of low budgetary allocation by the Central Government. People who have been sanctioned pension do not get free food grain under Annapurna Scheme. It is necessary to provide cheap food grain to such people as they destitute and the

pension they get is small. For the benefit of destitute and disabled such beneficiaries of National Old Age Pensions Scheme and National Social Security Pension Scheme will be given 10 Kilogram food grain at BPL rate on “10 Kg Saffron ration card” made under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojan who do not have BPL, Antyodaya or Annapurna ration cards. For this purpose, the State Government will take food grain at APL rate from the Central Government and give it at BPL rate to the beneficiaries and give the difference in amount to the State Civil Supplies Corporation.

5) **Type of Ration Cards and entitlements under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna** – Following types of ration cards will be issued under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojan: -

a) **Saffron ration card** –

One) Saffron ration cards will be issued to those non scheduled caste, non scheduled tribe blue ration card holders in rural areas, whose names are included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of survey done in the years 1991 or 1997 but not included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of the survey done in the year 2002.

Two) Saffron ration cards will be issued to those non scheduled caste, non scheduled tribe blue ration card holders in urban areas, whose names are included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of survey done in the year 1991 but not included in the BPL list prepared on the basis of the survey done in the year 1997.

b) **Gray ration cards** – Gray ration cards will be issued to those scheduled caste and scheduled tribe families who are not Antyodaya ration card holder and in rural areas whose named are included in the BPL list of the year 2002, or in both rural and urban areas who are blue ration card holders on the basis of being included in the BPL lists prepared on the basis of previous surveys. In addition to this Grey ration cards will also be issued to all such families of Primitive Tribal Groups who are not Antyodaya of Annapurna ration card holders whether or not their name is included in any BPL list.

c) **Saffron ration cards of 10 Kg entitlement** – Saffron ration cards of 10 Kg entitlement will be issued to those beneficiaries of the National Old Age Pension Scheme and National Social Security Pension Scheme who do not have Blue colored BPL ration cards, Pink colored Antyodaya ration cards or Yellow colored Annapurna Ration Cards.

6) **Implementation of Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna** – Following activities will be done for the implementation of this scheme: -

a) **Making and distribution of ration cards** – The work of making of ration cards under this scheme will be done at district level by the district collector in the time limit fixed by the State Government. Following activities will be done for making ration cards –

One) Making of lists – Lists will be prepared for making ration cards as follows: -

I) Making of lists for new ration cards on the basis of old BPL ration card register and other registers – A photocopy of old BPL ration cards register will be made. First this photocopy will be compared with the Antyodaya register. Those names which are included in Antyodaya register will be deleted from this photocopy list. This modified photocopy list will then be compared with Annapurna register. Those names which are included in Annapurna register will also be deleted from the photocopy list. Thereafter –

i) In rural areas the photocopy list will be compared with the BPL list of the year 2002. Those names which are included in the BPL list of 2002 will also be deleted from the photocopy list. The names now remaining in the photocopy list will be computerized. In front of the names of Scheduled caste and Scheduled tribe “Gray Card” will be written, and in front of the remaining names “Saffron Card” will be written.

ii) In urban areas the photocopy list will be compared with the BPL list of the year 1997. “Yellow Card” will be written in front of the names which are included in the BPL list of 1997. Cards under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna will not be prepared for these people as BPL Yellow ration cards will be made for them. Of the remaining names “Gray Card” will be written in front of the names of Scheduled caste and Scheduled tribe, and “Saffron Card” will be written in front of all other names.

II) Making list for new ration cards in rural areas on the basis of the BPL list of the year 2002 – A photocopy of the BPL list of the year 2002 will be made in rural areas. Non scheduled castes and non scheduled tribes names will be deleted from this photocopy list. Names included in the Antyodaya register and Annapurna register will also be deleted from this list. Remaining names will be computerized and “Gray card” will be written in front of them.

III) Making list for new cards on the basis of list of beneficiaries of National Old Age Pension Scheme and National Social Security Pension Scheme – A photocopy

will be made of the list of beneficiaries of National Old Age Pension Scheme and National Social Security Pension Scheme. Names of those who have Antyodaya, BPL or Annapurna cards will be deleted from this list. Of the names remaining in the list, “Gray Card” will be written in front of the names of Primitive Tribal Groups, and “10 Kg Saffron Card” will be written in front of the remaining names.

IV) Making of list of Primitive Tribal Groups – In those districts where Primitive Tribal Groups live, a list of Primitive Tribal Group families will be made through a survey of such families. A photocopy of this list will be made. Those names which are included in the Antyodaya or Annpurna register will be deleted from this list. Those names which are included in the BPL list of the years 1991, 1997 or 2002 will also be deleted from this photocopy list. “Gray Card” will be written in front of the remaining names in the list.

Two) Printing of New Ration Cards – Computerization of the lists prepared as described above will be done at district level using the software provided by the Food Directorate. After computerization is completed, ration cards will be prepared in electronic form along with the name of the beneficiary and other particulars at the district level. The soft copy of ration cards so prepared will be sent for printing to the agency fixed for printing of ration cards by the food directorate at the State level. Ration cards will be printed with the name of the beneficiary and barcode. After printing hologram will be affixed on the ration cards. Printed ration cards will be kept Village Panchayat wise in rural areas and ward wise in urban areas. The District collector will appoint a authorized officer by an order in writing for issuing ration cards for each village panchayat and urban local body. The Authorized officer appointed by the collector shall check the ration cards printed at the state level by comparing them with the BPL lists of the years 1991, 1997 and 2002, Blue Ration Card Regiset, Antyodaya Register, Annapurna Register, Beneficiary registers of National Old Age Pension Scheme and National Social Security Pension Scheme, and list of Primitive Tribal Group Families. The Authorized officer will put his seal and signature on the ration cards found correct after

checking. Those ration cards which are not found correct will be sent to the district collector, who will remove their entries from the computer and destroy them. The entries of such ration cards will be crossed over in the ration card registers with red ink. The information about family members will be filled in the ration cards signed by the authorized officer, by the panchayat secretary in rural areas and an employee of the urban local body in urban areas. In rural areas sarpanch and in urban areas ward member will sign the card as a proof of the information being correct.

Three) Distribution of new Ration Cards – New ration cards will be kept panchayat wise and will be distributed in camps organized in each village panchayat. Publicity of the date, and place of distribution of cards will be done previously so that no one is deprived from getting the card. If even after this some cards remain undistributed, they will be given to the village panchayat for distribution. A ration card register in form-1 will be kept at the village panchayat/urban local body level for distribution of ration cards. In this register for very color of ration cards there will be pages of the same color in which information about the ration cards of that color will be printed. One copy of the ration cards register will also be kept in the Fair Price Shop and in the Tahsildar office. Ration Card registers will be available for inspection by public in all three places. In addition to this ration card register will also be available on the web site of the Department of Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs.

Four) Making Ration Cards for families left out – A family who in spite of being eligible under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayat Yojna, does not get a ration card for some reason, may apply to the Tahsildar for getting a new ration card according to its eligibility. The tahsildar on satisfying himself after due enquiry, regarding the eligibility of the applicant to get a ration card under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna will send a report to the collector. The collector will get the ration card printed after making entries in the compute and get it distributed through the village panchayat.

Five) Duplicate Ration Cards – If a ration card under this scheme is lost or destroyed, a person may apply to the tahsildar for making a duplicate ration card. Tahsildar will verify from record that the ration card of the applicant was made under the

scheme. Thereafter the tahsildar will record a statement on oath of the applicant regarding the loss or destruction of the ration card. The tahsildar will then send a report to the collector for making a duplicate ration card giving the number of the old ration card. The collector will get a duplicate ration card prepared after making an entry to this effect in the computer and get it distributed through the village panchayat.

- b) **Distribution of Commodities under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna** – Beneficiaries will get commodities from Fair Price Shops under this scheme in the same manner in which they get commodities under other schemes of Public Distribution System.
 - c) **Allotment, Storage etc. of commodities under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna** – Allotment of commodities under this scheme shall be made from the State to the districts once a year based on the number of ration cards. Allotment will be issued from the district level for Fair Price Shops every month based on the number of ration cards. State Civil Supplies Corporation shall issue release orders every month based on the allotment, and will get the stocking of commodities done through lead societies or under door step delivery scheme in the same manner in which it is done for other schemes of Public Distribution System. The account of commodities provided under this scheme shall be kept separately in the same format in which it is kept for other schemes of Public Distribution System.
- 7) **Payment of the difference in amount to the State Civil Supplies Corporation under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna** –
- a) The difference in amount of APL and BPL food grain prices shall be payable to the State Civil Supplies Corporation for food grains distributed on Saffron ration cards and 10 Kg Saffron ration cards.
 - b) The difference in amount payable to State Civil Supplies Corporation for food grains distributed on Gray ration cards under Mukhya Mantri Khadyanna Sahayata Yojna shall be as follows: -
 - One)** The difference in amount of BPL and Antoydaya food grain prices shall be payable to the State Civil Supplies Corporation for food grains distributed on those Gray ration cards whose names are included in the BPL list of the year 2002 in rural areas and 1997 in urban areas.
 - Two)** The difference in amount of APL and Antoydaya food grain prices shall be payable to the State Civil Supplies Corporation for food grains distributed on those Gray ration cards whose

names are not included in the BPL list of the year 2002 in rural areas and 1997 in urban areas.

- c) A utilization certificate in form-2 a and form-2 b jointly signed by district manager of State Civil Supplies Corporation and Collector of the concerned district shall be submitted to the State Government by the State Civil Supplies Corporation for every trimester, on the basis of which State Government shall give the difference in amount to the State Civil Supplies Corporation.

8) Monitoring and Evaluation –

- a) The monitoring of this scheme shall be done at all levels by the monitoring committees formed for the monitoring of Public Distribution System.
- b) Evaluation of the scheme shall be done after one year of starting the scheme.
- c) The system of redress of Public Grievances shall be the same as the system of grievance redress under Public Distribution System.

- 9) Publicity of the Scheme –** Wide publicity will be given to the scheme so that everybody is able to get full benefit of the scheme and every one is aware of the entitlements and rate of commodities based on the color of ration cards. During publicity it will also be made clear that no name is being added or deleted from any BPL list under this scheme. On the other hand ration cards under this scheme are being prepared based on these BPL lists for distribution of commodities under Public Distribution System.
